What is the new creation we have become? Do you feel new? 5:17

What is the ministry of reconciliation? Who does this ministry? 5:18

In chapter 6, was Paul calling for Christians to divorce their unbelieving spouse?

In 7:9-11, what is the difference between worldly and Godly sorrow? * Hint: think of the differences between King Saul and David, Judas and Peter

Why should we excel in the "grace of giving"? 8:7

Why would God love a cheerful giver? 9:7

How would you explain generosity resulting in Thanksgiving to God? 9:11

What weapons do we have available to help us fight our battles? 10:4

Paul mentions in 11 being afraid the Corinthians would believe in a different gospel or a different Jesus because of someone's preaching...what different gospels or Jesus could we believe today?

What is a super-apostle? 11:5

What should we boast about? Do you feel that Paul likes to boast about his suffering?

In chapter 12 who is the man caught up to the third heaven? Who was it, and what are the 3 heavens he is talking about?

What was the thorn in the flesh? 12:7

One of Paul's final exhortations was for the people to check themselves (13:5) how can we do that today? What would you find?
