

Walk-Through the Bible-John Leaders Guide

Who is John?

What is the purpose of his book?

Before the end of Chapter 1 from verses 15-51 John uses seven different titles for Jesus. What are they and what is he trying to show his readers?

**What is Jesus referring to when he tells Nathanael that he will see heaven open and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man?
John 1:51**

John refers to Jesus changing the water into wine as the first sign, what was the meaning behind the sign?

John 3 Jesus says that you must be born again. Nicodemus is confused at this. What is Jesus saying?

In John 4 Jesus claims to be the living water, what does he mean by this?

What was the meaning of the second sign in John 4:46-54?

In John 5 why did Jesus not just say get up and walk, instead he includes pick up your mat which made it against the sabbath rules?

In John 5:31-47 Jesus claims that there are others that point to Him being the Son of God. Who are they?

After the third sign (the feeding of 5,000 men) the people wanted to make Jesus king, that was the claim made in John 1, why did Jesus withdraw to a mountain by Himself and not accept their offer?

Many people stopped following Jesus when He said Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in them. (John 6:56) What was the meaning behind his words?

Once again in the book of John Jesus is at odds with the teachers with claims over his authority and from where he comes. In 8:58 Jesus says “before Abraham was born, I am.” At this the elders were so upset they picked up stones to kill Jesus. Why were they so enraged?

Whose fault was the man’s blindness in John 9:1-12?

Jesus says, I am the gate for the sheep. What does He mean?

Jesus also says He is the good shepherd, what does that mean?

In John 10:19-21 how do we see the effects of his teachings and miracles?

Jesus says, I am the resurrection and the life. What is the good news of this claim?

I read verse 47-48 of chapter 11 and it makes me wonder how hard can hearts be? Where else have we seen hard hearts in the scriptures and where have you seen hard hearts in your own life?

In John 13:34-35 “Jesus says a new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another.” Loving one another is not a new command so why does Jesus say that it is?

Jesus makes another I am statement by saying “he is the way, the truth, and the life, (John 14:6)” in your own words explain the significance of his claim?

Jesus’ final “I am” statement comes from John 15:1 saying I am the true vine. What point is Jesus making to his disciples?

In your own mind why did the guards fall to the ground when Jesus said, “I am he” in John 18:6?

Why do many scholars see the cross as the closure of the Old Testament?

Read John 19:35 John is referring to himself as seeing the crucifixion of Jesus and it being all true. Why does John make that point?

What do you think the disciple believed in John 20:8?

Why are we the blessed ones that believe even though we haven’t seen?
