1 Corinthians part 2 chapters 8-16

What does Paul mean that “knowledge puffs up while love builds up”? 8:1
Where have you seen negative consequences of puffed up love?

In chapter 9 why does Paul not claim any of the rights of apostleship? What were some of those rights?

At the end of Chapter 9 Paul says do not run like a “man running aimlessly or man beating the air,” what does this look like for today’s Christian? How can we be sure to stand and not fall?

Why does Paul say that we should flee for idolatry in Chapter 10?

How does verses 10:23-24 sum up what Paul has said about personal freedom?

Chapter 10 ends with a great way to live life “do it all for the glory of God;” how well have you lived out that mantra in your life today?

What traditions do you think Paul was talking about in 11:2?

In 11:2-16 what is the main problem that Paul is addressing? What are the two cultural issues that are clashing in this section?

In Chapter 11 what was causing divisions around the Lord’s supper (verse 27)?
How does one partake of communion in an unworthy way?

Why did the church receive gifts from the Holy Spirit? What is your gifting?

What does it mean to speak in tongues? And how should that gift be used?

Why do you think Paul ends chapter 12 with “eagerly desire the greater gifts”? Should we not be content with the gift we receive?

What is greater than any spiritual gift or what should accompany every gift?

Why is love greater than faith and hope? 13:13

What verse in chapter 14 do you believe best summarizes Paul's thoughts about how corporate worship should take place?

In chapter 15 the central theme of the gospel is given, what is it? Why are these verses so important?

If there is no resurrection of the dead, body or soul, why are we to be more pitied than anyone? 15:18

As you read 15:35-56 and consider your own death, what is most comforting about Paul's words?

Which of Paul's final instruction in 16:13-14 do you find easy to apply, which is hardest?

After reading this letter what is your greatest take away?
